Summary of PP spending for 2020-2021 academic year

Objectives in spending Pupil Premium Grant:

To objective of Pupil Premium Grant is to improve the life chances of disadvantaged pupils through raising their attainment, supporting their emotional wellbeing and ensuring they have equal access to opportunities.

The aspiration is for pupils to meet or exceed the expected standard across the curriculum, making expected progress from their starting points. This will be achieved by providing quality first teaching and personalised individual and group support. The grant also provides tailored interventions for children who need emotional support to enable them to maximise their potential and lead healthy active lives and access to extra curricula opportunities

- £16,905 to continue to fund the Pupil Premium Champion role that provides individual and small group academic support
- £832 to subsidise trips and after school provision
- £1,938 to part fund Learning Mentor support that offers vital support for children's social and emotional wellbeing
- £253 line management, monitoring and evaluation costs by senior leadership team

Disadvantaged pupils are:

- in receipt of free school meals (or have been in the past 6 years)
- children in care
- adopted children
- children who have a parent or parents serving in the armed forces
