Growing and Changes in Nature	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Describe seasonal changes ● Use key vocabulary relating to natural change, e.g. weather, seasons, cold, hot ● Describe the life cycle of an animal eg frog, chicken
When I was a baby	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Share their own experiences and listen to those of the others eg talk about things and experiences they remember before they started at Turtles
Girls and Boys	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Talk about the similarities and differences between the boys and girls ● Play with everyone in FSU
People who keep me safe	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Recognise potential dangers and how to stay safe, inside and outside ● Explain what they should do if they feel unsafe

RECEPTION	
Seasons	<p>By the end of FSU children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Name the different seasons and describe their differences. ● Explain the changes that occur as seasons change. ● Talk about how they have grown in resilience.
Life stages: Plants, animals and humans	<p>By the end of FSU children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● To understand that animals and humans change in appearance over time.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Use relevant vocabulary such as egg, seed, baby, grow, change, old, young in relation to the life cycles of animals and plants (and the names for young animals). ● Make observations and ask questions about living things. ● Talk about their own experience of growing up ● Talk about how they have changed as they have grown
We are all different	<p>By the end of FSU children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Understand that every family is different. ● Talk about similarities and differences between themselves and others. ● Understand that we are all unique
Me and my body	<p>By the end of FSU children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Name parts of the body using the correct vocabulary. ● Explain which parts of their body are kept private and safe and why eg through the story 'Aliens love underpants' ● Tell or ask an appropriate adult for help if they feel unsafe.
Keeping myself safe	<p>By the end of FSU children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Talk about how to keep their bodies healthy and safe. ● Know how to stay safe in their home, classroom and outside. ● Know age-appropriate ways to stay safe online - E-safety talk about being kind in person and online ● Name adults in their lives and those in their community who keep them safe.

<p>What could Harold do?</p> <p>Statutory - DfE Relationships Education, Sex Education & Health Education and science curriculum</p>	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Understand that medicines can sometimes make people feel better when they’re ill; ● Explain simple issues of safety and responsibility about medicines and their use
<p>Super sleep</p> <p>Statutory - DfE Relationships Education, Sex Education & Health Education and science curriculum</p>	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Recognise the importance of sleep in maintaining a healthy, balanced lifestyle; ● Identify simple bedtime routines that promote healthy sleep

<p>Fun or not?</p> <p>Statutory - DfE Relationships Education, Sex Education & Health Education</p>	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Recognise that some touches are not fun and can hurt or be upsetting; ● Know that they can ask someone to stop touching them; ● Identify who they can talk to if someone touches them in a way that makes them feel uncomfortable.
<p>My body, your body</p> <p>Statutory - DfE Relationships Education, Sex Education & Health Education and science curriculum</p> <p>Lesson plan PDF available</p>	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Identify which parts of the human body are private; ● Explain that a person's genitals help them to make babies when they are grown up; ● Understand that humans mostly have the same body parts but that they can look different from person to person
<p>Some secrets should never be kept</p> <p>Statutory - DfE Relationships Education, Sex Education & Health Education</p>	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Identify how inappropriate touch can make someone feel; ● Understand that there are unsafe secrets and secrets that are nice surprises; ● Explain that if someone is being touched in a way that they don't like they have to tell someone in their safety network so they can help it stop

<p>Basic First Aid St John ambulance lesson plans – asthma attack</p> <p>Statutory - DfE Relationships Education, Sex Education & Health Education</p>	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Identify a casualty who is having an asthma attack ● Assess and give first aid to a casualty who is having difficulty breathing due to an asthma attack ● Understand when to seek medical help for a casualty who is choking

<p>Help or harm?</p> <p>Statutory - DfE Relationships Education, Sex Education & Health Education and science curriculum</p>	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Understand that medicines are drugs and suggest ways that they can be helpful or harmful

<p>Alcohol and cigarettes: the facts</p> <p>Statutory - DfE Relationships Education, Sex Education & Health Education and science curriculum</p>	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Identify some key risks from and effects of cigarettes and alcohol; ● Know that most people choose not to smoke cigarettes; (Social Norms message) ● Define the word 'drug' and understand that nicotine and alcohol are both drugs

<p>Basic First Aid St John ambulance lesson plans – bites and stings</p> <p>Statutory - DfE Relationships Education, Sex Education & Health Education</p>	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Ensure the safety of them and others ● Assess a casualty's condition calmly and identify an allergic reaction to a bite or sting ● Comfort and reassure a casualty who has been bitten or stung ● Seek medical help if required for a choking casualty
