AROUND THE CLASSES

Turtles & Dolphins (FSU)

The Gruffalo came back to see us this week and we were able to interview him, we asked him lots of questions and found out a lot more about him. We finished the week off by making not Gruffalo crumble but apple and raspberry crumble, it was delicious.

Sea Lions (Year 1)

This week we have been measuring in Maths; we have estimated and measured capacity in the water tray, we have compared and weighed boxes and we have measured our body parts. We have played some place value games and sorted numbers into Carroll diagrams. We have discussed and written what we know about Post Offices and are writing letters to take to the Post Office. We have continued our weaving work and have started making Christmas decorations as well as props for the Nativity. We were really impressed with the imaginative number lines that were produced for the homework task - Well done!



Lundy Puffins (Year 2)

Lundy Puffins have written a fantastic class story about the Fairy Godmother in the style of the book 'Previously'. They used what we had been learning about noun phrases to write descriptive sentences. Next week they will be writing their own 'Previously' stories about a fairy tale character of their choice.

They've been busy making angels for the corridor display and have been using moving toys to investigate pushes and pulls. They are all looking forward to our first performance of 'The Nativity' next week.
