Tasks to do at home for Dolphins, week beginning 1st June lasting three weeks.

Maths

What day is it today? What day was it yesterday? Tomorrow? What month are we in? Which season are we in? What is the date? How do we write that date? Talk about the weather.

Counting from x number and finish at x number (e.g. start at 6 and finish at 22.)

Adding – roll two dice and add objects together, tell your mum and dad the number sentence and draw a picture.

Taking away – play fishy, fishy, fingers to take away. Roll two dice, count out objects, take the number away and hide behind your back, how many left? What does it look like as a picture?

Making numbers using teens and ones e.g. 24 is 10,20,4.

Make number line play guess my number

Think of a number and what is 1 more? 1 less? 2 more? 2less?

Make a set of Dominoes, look for ones that have the same number these are called 'doubles'. Doubles mean you add the same number to itself. Can you work out double 4? Double 6? Double 10? Can you write it as a number sentence? Can you think of other doubles?

Make a set of Numicon and use it to work out doubles as well.

Can you make a repeating pattern with objects in your house?

PART, PART, WHOLE – have a number (the whole) e.g. 11 how many different ways can you make 11? (The parts)

<u>Literacy</u>

Write 2/3 sentences about what you've done the previous day. Please do not write the sentences out for the children to copy or help them with any spellings. The children need to do this using their phonic skills, the writing does not need to be spelt correctly.

Read phonics play comics – www.phonicsplay.co.uk/comics

Play Obb and Bob on Phonics Play (www.phonicsplay.co.uk) Any phase 3 sounds will be fine.

Go over reading and spelling all Tricky Words – I, go, to, no, the, into, she, he, me, be, we, all, are, they, was, you, her, do, so, have, like, said, there, were, come, some, what, when, out, one, little.

Go over reading and spelling all sounds – ch, sh, th, ee, ai, oa, oo, or, ar, ow, oi, ur, er, igh, ear, air. Write these sounds on a piece of paper and ask children to write foam, sheep, paid, took, boot, cart, fort, turn, down, hammer (if children write 1 m that is fine), right, beard, hair, chick, shell, moth.

How words can you think of which each sound in (one sound a day) It doesn't matter if it uses a different spelling e.g. if the children write saim for same that's fine.

Use Phonics Time Play on Youtube.

Share bedtime story books with your family.

Teach your monster to read website/app

Oxford reading owls website/app

Write 2/3 sentences about the water cycle, how does it work?

Write 2/3 sentences about what can be found in rivers.

Write 2/3 sentences about what can be found in the seas.

Draw a picture of what you like doing in the summer and write 2/3 sentences about it.

Can you retell a story to your family?

Can you make up a story and tell it/act it out to your family?

Write a list of things we can do in summer.

The Arts

Use a pair of scissors to cut out paper and create a collage of your favourite thing to do in the summer.

Pen drawings of the water cycle

Google 'Art Attack' and make your own art attack about the summer.

Can you create the water cycle in your garden?

Draw a detailed picture of a river, cut it up into a puzzle and ask someone in your house to make it. Time it, can you beat each others times?

Can you create a river in your garden?

Use some chalk or water and a brush and draw a picture of summer
