

**Years 1 English home learning for the week commencing 18th May****Writing**

Aim to spend around 20 minutes each day

Use the Stick Man home learning booklet this week

Day 1	If you have a copy of 'Stick Man' at home, ask someone at home to read it to you or you can have a go at reading it yourself. If you don't have a copy of the book you could listen to the illustrator here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=OFhJrLVu3T0 Or watch the short film here: https://www.bbc.co.uk/programmes/b06t09rk Make a list of all the things stick man is used for. Use a range of props from around your house and imagine what they could be used as / for. For example, a hairbrush could be a microphone, a skipping rope could be a belt. You could draw or write some of your ideas.
Day 2	Think about what else you could use a stick for. Challenge yourself to think of something that is not in the story. Create a list of alternative uses. You could have a go at making a stick man.
Day 3	Make your own cartoon strip to tell another part of the stick man story. What happens to him this time? How does he escape? Remember to use speech bubbles in your cartoon.
Day 4	Write the story to go alongside your comic strip
Day 5	Perform your story to someone at home. You could make some props or stick puppets to go with it. You could try an activity from here: https://www.stickmanofficial.com/book/

In our Phonics session we would have a 60 second challenge where everyone had to write as many words as they can think of with the sound we were learning that day. It didn't have to be the same spelling but did have to make the right sound. So for instance on Tuesday when the sound is 'o' children could write: go, know, boat, toe, rope etc. but they couldn't write 'hot' because although it has an 'o' in it, it doesn't make the right sound. We would then write lots of the words on the board and write a silly sentence using as many of the words as possible. For instance 'I know I can go in the boat because my toe is made of rope.' As they will be thinking of the words themselves they may need longer than a minute to think of enough words for a sentence, but not too long as it is supposed to be short and snappy. If parents join in too you could make it a competition to see who can think of the most words, and to see whether you can beat the total from the day before. They don't have to write the sentence, they can just say it out loud but obviously if they want to write the sentence then that's great, remind them to use capital letters and end marks.
