

**Year 1 English home learning for the week commencing 1st June****Writing**

Aim to spend around 20 minutes each day

Day 1	Ask someone to read Sayeeda, the pirate princess or you can listen to it here: https://soundcloud.com/talkforwriting/sayeeda/s-ewAQumNjrJt Talk about the story and fill in the sticky notes (you can ask someone else to write down your ideas) Which character did you like best? Why? Did anything surprise you about the story? What did Sayeeda learn by the end of the story?
Day 2	Read or listen to the story together again. Draw a line to match the speaker with the correct image. Have a go at the quiz time (remember - you can ask someone to write down your ideas).
Day 3	These are some words from the story: swoop, glide, fly, breeze, galleon. When you've worked out what they mean, perhaps you can write each one in a new sentence.

Day 5	List 6 things you could put in your treasure chest. We will continue next week....
