

**Year 1 English home learning for the week commencing 8th June****Writing**

Aim to spend around 20 minutes each day

Day 1	Diary writing The diary entry has no capital letters and full stops. Can you help to put them in the right place? Try writing it out in your very best handwriting. If you'd like to do some more, you can try writing your own diary entry with capital letters and full stops and your very best handwriting. It could be about something you have done, or it could be something you have made up. You could even write a diary as if you are a pirate on another adventure.
Day 2	How to make a pirate hat. Read the instructions and then have a go at making your own pirate hat (you don't have to use newspaper; you can use any other newspaper you have). You can even share a photograph or video of you wearing your hat on Flipgrid for your friends to see.
Day 3	Use the words to make up a new story for Sayeeda's brother, Fergus. What adventures might he get up to? Tell your story to someone and then you can have a go at writing it down, or you can ask someone to help you write it down.
Day 4	Read the treasure box poem, or you can ask someone to help you read it. Have a go at solving the riddles.
Day 5	Sayeeda received a message in a bottle. Read the message and have a go at writing a reply. Next week we will be continuing with the pirate book and you'll be making your own treasure map!
