Day 1	Look at the story plan on page 14. Plan your own story about some elves that help
	people.
	Think about: where your story takes place, the characters in your story, what
	happens (beginning, middle and end).
	If you are finding this too tricky, you could write your own story about something
	you have read or something that interests you. Make sure you have thought about
	how your story starts, what happens in the middle and how the story ends.
Day 2	Spend today writing and editing your story. Think about capital letters and full
	stops. What interesting words can you use? You could even borrow some of the
	words you looked at last week (page 9).
	If you are writing your own story and struggling with how to start it, you could look
	at one of the pictures and story starters here:

Day 3	The storm elf wants to make an umbrella, but is not sure what material to use. Can
	you help them?
	How will you test the materials on page 15? If you don't have the exact materials
	in your house, don't worry – you could use other items. Check with a grown up
	first!
Day 4	Write up your investigation. Use the template on page 16 to help with this.
Day 5	Read the riddle on page 17 to someone at home. Get them to guess what animal
	the riddle is about.
	Have a go at writing your own riddle.
